

Christmas door wreath

Christmas is just around the corner and what could decorate your home more festively than a homemade Christmas wreath?

With these easy-to-follow instructions, you can conjure up a beautiful wreath in no time at all that will not only decorate your door only but will also be a real pleasure to make.



Lay the "Reindeer" taffeta ribbon across the willow wreath. Make sure that the ribbon is evenly distributed and does not crease.

Securely attach the ends of the ribbon to the wreath using hot glue. The hot glue ensures that the ribbon is firmly and permanently attached to the wreath.

Cut the silver fir garland to the desired length. Make sure that the garland reaches all the way around the willow wreath without protruding too much. Now use hot glue to attach the silver fir garland to the wreath. Press the

garland lightly to make sure it holds well.

Stick the christmas balls into the wreath. Distribute them evenly so that the wreath is nicely decorated all around. Use some hot glue to fix the baubles securely in place.

Finally, tie pretty ribbons to the wreath. You can use different colors and patterns to give your wreath a personal touch. Make sure that the ribbons fit well and are not too loose so that they don't fall off. Turn your craft project into a special experience and bring the Christmas spirit into your home. Have fun crafting!
