

Gift wrapping from craft sticks

Are you still looking for a beautiful **gift wrapping**? We have just the thing for you. Create a beautiful wooden gift box for a candle and a self-cast candle holder with **craft blocks**.



This is how you design the gift wrappings:

For the **wooden block box**, glue the blocks together with **handicraft glue** as shown in the picture. Saw three of the wooden blocks to the right size. Place the gifts in the individual compartments.

To decorate the gifts, wrap the stick **candle** and the cookies in protective sleeves. Close the ends with a thin perlon thread and tie two jingles to them. You can now place them in the wooden block box. Next, mix the **casting** compound for the candlestick according to the instructions. Fill the casting moulds about half full. After 30 - 45 minutes you can remove the candlestick from the mould. Leave it to air dry for another 45 minutes and then place it in the wooden block box.

Next, stick a sticker of your choice onto a piece of cardboard for the decoration pendant and cut it close to the edge. Punch a hole in the top, e.g. with a hole punch. Wrap the cord around the wooden block box and attach the decoration pendant to it. Tie a nice bow at the end. Now tie the ends in a knot and curl up the cord ends.

Tip: If you want the gifts to lie safely in the box, you can fix them with Patafix on the bottom.
