

Lucky Wands for the Wedding

Difficulty: Beginner 🍴🍴🍴🍴

Working time: 2 Hours

The **lucky wands** are a new trend that has come over to us from the USA. True to the motto "Wave your wedding wand to wish them well, show them love, by ringing your bell", the **little sticks are made to ring**.

This tradition is a good alternative for our custom of throwing rice when the bride & groom come out of the church or registry office, as in many places it is now forbidden to throw rice, confetti or flowers.

In our tutorial, we show you how easy it is to recreate this great trend and make your wedding a highlight.




Instructions for the lucky sticks:

1. First paint the bamboo skewers with craft paint in the colour of your choice. In our example, we used the beautiful VBS craft colour pastel olive green.
2. Cut different lengths of ribbon and twist them in the middle with winding wire.
3. Use hot glue to stick the ribbons into the opening of a wooden ball.
4. Thread the bells and balls onto the skewer.
5. Fix the last wooden ball with the ribbons using a little hot glue.
6. The ribbons can be decorated with satin florets or other scatter pieces as desired.

It is also nice to use them during the wedding ceremony after the ringing. These can replace the ringing of the glasses to invite the bride & groom to **kiss** and are also **decorative accessories** on the tables.
