What is quilling?

Quilling is a creative technique in which paper strips are rolled and shaped. The ends are fixed with glue so that the figures retain their shape.

The basic shape of quilling is the circle. A spiral is made from this in no time at all. Further shapes such as eyes, drops or flowers are created by carefully pressing the spiral together. Using a simple tool such as a toothpick, the paper strips can be rolled up and then glued together. **Quilling** impresses with its ease of use and fascinates creative craft fans worldwide.

The history of quilling

Did you know that quilling has a long and rich history? The crafting technique is by no means new. The first parallels and techniques can be traced back to the ancient Egyptians. Quilling has been known as a craft technique since the Renaissance. Back then, monks and nuns made filigree decorations for book covers from paper strips, that were left over from cutting books. These were covered with gold paint and offered an inexpensive alternative to real gold ornaments, sometimes barely distinguishable from the "valuable" decorations. Quilling became popular in Europe in the 18th century. For English ladies in particular, it was the pastime par excellence and tea caddies and pieces of furniture, for example, were decorated with the filigree paper strips. The settlers eventually brought the crafting technique to America. There, kandelaaar were often decorated with quilling.

Quilling today

Quilling is no longer the exclusive preserve of posh English ladies. Craft fans from all over the world love the creative technique. They call themselves "quillers". Quilling is inexpensive, but rich in creative possibilities - which is why it is so popular as a hobby. Today, paper strips are eagerly rolled and shaped for every conceivable occasion. quilling decorations are commonly used on cards, boxes, pendants, mobiles and jewelry or simply pictures made up of various quilling elements to create a complete work of art.

Quilling is easy to learn and is a great way to practise patience, concentration and skill. Start with simple ornaments or floral motifs that are easy to create.

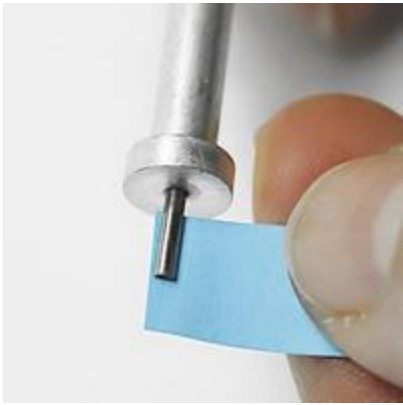

What do I need for quilling?

Essentials:

- [Many paper strips](#)
- A transparent [paper glue](#) that dries quickly
- A pair of [scissors](#)

- Toothpicks



[quilling pin](#) to make it easier to roll up

- A [folding bone](#) for neat folding
- Thin [double-sided adhesive tape](#)
- [Quilling-stencil and base](#) for precisely fitting circles and for combining the individual parts
- [Quilling comb](#) for further shapes
- [pins](#) to connect individual parts

 paper strips are available in many colors and patterns. If you don't have the right strip, you can easily cut it yourself.

Popular quilling techniques

3D quilling

Sculptural figures are created when the twisted spirals are carefully pushed apart with the fingers. Or by arranging the paper strips in such a way that they form a three-dimensional object.



Comb quilling:

You can weave paper strips using the teeth of the **quilling comb**. This technique enables many filigree creations. Comb quilling can be used to create intricate stars, decorations or jewelry, such as earrings.



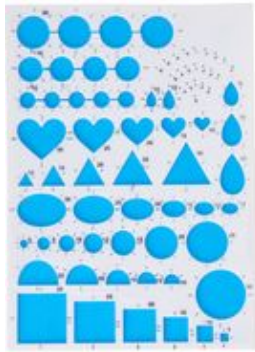
Free quilling

You can also create your own figures and motifs. For each project, the outlines of the desired figure are first formed and fixed using paper strips. The shapes are then filled with squiggles made from quilling strips.
