# Chair Pad

#### **TENSION**

 $9 dc \times 10 rows = 10 \times 10 cm$ 

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

sl stslip stitchdcdouble crochetst(s)stitch(es)

inc increase (2 dc in same stitch)

rep repeat

### **NOTES**

The chair pad is worked in spiral rounds, the rounds are not closed with a slip stitch, the first stitch of the new round is worked on the first stitch of the previous round.

Thus a smooth change from round to round is created. To recognize the beginning of the round, it is recommended to place a stitch marker into the first stitch. Due to the structure and the yarn weight it is preferable to work loosely in order to make it is easier to insert the crochet hook into the stitches. From the 3rd round on the double crochets are not worked as usual but by inserting the hook into the horizontal loop behind the stitches. (s. picture 1). On the front the stitch will look like a knitted stitch (picture 2). To close the last stitch of the last round a sling stitch is used for a smooth finish.

# INSTRUCTION

Rd 1: start with a magic ring closed with a sl st, make 8 dc  $\,$ 

Rd 2: 1 inc in every stitch (16 sts)

From here the dc are worked through the loop behind the stitch!

Rd 3: \*1 dc, 1 inc\*, repeat from \* to \* to last st = 24 sts

Rd 4:  $^*$ 2 dc, 1 inc $^*$ , rep from  $^*$  to  $^*$  to last st = 32 sts

Rd 5: \*3 dc, 1 inc\*, rep from \* to \* to last st = 40 sts

Rd 6: 7 inc in the round (47 sts)

Rd 7: 7 inc in the round (54 sts)

Rd 8: 6 inc in the round (62 sts)

Rd 9: 6 inc in the round (68 sts)

Rd 10: 5 inc in the round (73 sts)

Rd 11: 4 inc in the round (77 sts)

Rd 12: 4 inc in the round (81 sts) Rd 13: 3 inc in the round (84 sts)

Rd 14: 3 inc in the round (87 sts)

Rd 15: 1 dc in every st, 1 sl st in first st

To sew in the ends you might like to divide the yarn into single strands, this is the best way to hide the ends invisibly.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

# **WASHING ADVICE**

- Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets.
- Do not bleach.
- Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface.
- Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth.
- Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.
- Do not use optical brighteners (or any detergent containing optical brighteners). We recommend to use a softener to preserve the natural softness of the yarn.
