# Macrame snowflake

### **KNOTS USED**

Lark's head knot Square knot (see at the end step by step tutorials for these knots)

### **BEFORE STARTING**

Cut the following: 10x 30 cm ropes colour 00105 1x 20 cm ropes colour 00105

#### STEPS

**Step 1:** Take the 30 cm cords and double them over and attach to hoop with a reverse lark's head knot.



**Step 2:** Take 4 pieces and create a **square knot**. Repeat this all the way around.



**Step 3:** Take the outerwear 2 yarns from each side and join with a square knot. Repeat all the way around.





**Step 4:** Above the last square knot add another. Repeat all the way around (should resemble a snowflake now).



Step 5: Trim ends to about 3cm and brush. Trim ends with a diagonal cut.





**Step 6:** Take a 20cm piece of yarn tie a knot. Attach using a reverse lark's head knot to a central square knot to create hanging loop.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

### **WASHING ADVICE**

Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible - up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets. Do not bleach.

Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface. Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth. Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.

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


### LARK'S HEAD KNOT


Step 1: Fold one strand (consisting of a filler strand and a working strand) in half and place the loop on top of a cord, a rod or a ring.


Step 2: Fold the loop down the back


Step 3: Pull the ends of the strand through the loop and pull tightly.

The first basic knot is finished = 1 half square knot.


